Illinois Children's Healthcare Foundation. This study examines the effectiveness of a school-based intervention ("Bounce Back") for young students (grades Kindergarten through 3) exposed to trauma. Recruitment and intervention will occur at 8 schools in Cicero, Illinois. The second year of the project will focus on dissemination of "Bounce Back" to schools in Chicago and other areas of the state.
